**Grievance Arbitration:** \$1,400 per day. A hearing day is any portion of a day up to eight hours. Time is pro-rated for any day or substantial part of a day spent in hearings, preparation, and travel. A minimum of one day will be charged for a hearing. For per diem purposes a day is eight hours. **Cancellation:** One day's per diem charged for notice received 30 calendar days or fewer in advance. **Mediation, Fact Finding, and Interest Arbitration:** \$1,400 per day. **Travel Time:** Prorated per diem for any portion of a travel day up to or over 8 hours. **Expenses:** Actual cost of reasonable expenses; auto mileage charged at IRS rate.
