2. Docketing fee is charged on all cases to cover phone, fax, correspondence, postage, copying, etc.
3. Cancellation fee is one full day per diem for a case postponed or cancelled within ten business days of the scheduled hearing date. One-half day per diem for a postponement or cancellation more than ten business days before the scheduled date.
